#### **INITIATIVES**

The employment unit engaged in the following broad outreach initiatives in accordance with various elements of FCC Rule 73.2080(c)(2):

Hosted at least one job fair.

York College, February 16<sup>th</sup>, 2006

Co-sponsored at least one **job fair** with organizations in the business and professional community whose membership includes substantial participation by women and minorities.

WBAI along with the Asian Pacific Forum hosted 1 job fair at the Flushing Community College in June 2006

Participated in at least 4 events sponsored by organizations representing groups present in the community interested in broadcast employment issues, including conventions, career days, workshops, and similar activities.

- 1. May 2006 Malcolm X event sponsored in collaboration with several Black Community Organizations held at WBAI.
- 2. January 2006 WBAI sponsored a King Day Celebration at Brooklyn College.
- 3. February 2006 Friends of Long Island sponsored a seminar to observe Black History Month.
- 4. Joy of Resistance, a women's group sponsored a workshop to celebrate International Women's Day in March 2006.

WBAI Program Host, the Public Affairs Director, the Business Manager, the Arts Director, and the General Manager from the station attended these events.

Established an **internship** program designed to assist members of the community to acquire skills needed for broadcast employment.

Our Program Director continued an Internship Program. There were 6 interns and they worked 20 hours per week: 6 hours in the News Department, 6 hours in Public Affairs department, and 6 hours in the Production Department. In addition, the Operations Department established a separate internship program where the participants (3) were instructed in basic radio operations, including traffic, scheduling of on air promotions, and basic studio production.

Established training programs designed to enable station personnel to acquire skills that could qualify them for higher level positions.

Our News Department has an ongoing training program with members of the community which includes research and writing, digital editing and production, voice training and hands-on experience covering, reporting and producing news. Eight (8) interns were trained during this period.

WBAI provides a 5 week course designed to train volunteer reporter producers in maintaining websites. Training includes research and writing,

digital editing and production, voice training and hands-on experience covering, reporting and producing news. Training done by WBAI's Web Site Design & Maintenance employee and the station's News Director.

Participated in at least 4 events or programs sponsored by educational institutions relating to career opportunities in broadcasting.

WBAI staff participates in the broadcast journalism education departments of local universities as faculty and as guest lecturers on news and public affairs, station management, and the role of community radio in broadcasting.

- Live Community Radio Forum training students and community volunteers in how to produce live events for radio, Hofstra University, October 12, 2006, attended by Public Affairs Director
- Program Director was a guest lecturer at Medgar Evers College on Journalism (7/21/06)
- Public Affairs Radio Producer hosted panel discussion at BMC College on Political Science (10/22/2006)
- The General Manager lectured a Communications class at the New York Society for Ethical Culture (11/17/06)

Sponsored at least 2 events in the community designed to inform and educate the public as to employment opportunities in broadcasting.

WBAI Directors, General Manager, Program Director, Public Affairs and News participated in panel discussions on topics such as the role of Public as well as Independent media, how to enter the Public Radio environment, and training and employment opportunities at WBAI. This annual event took place at the Riverside Church on January 28, 2006

WBAI sponsored a community event at the Riverside Church in October 06 to discuss opportunities in journalism and broadcasting. Bernard White was the key note Speaker.

The Manhattan Neighborhood Network and WBAI sponsored a seminar at WBAI on August 2006 to educate the community about the importance of Free Speech Radio and the Media.

Provided training to management level personnel on methods of ensuring equal employment opportunity and prevent discrimination.

Provided **training** to personnel of unaffiliated non-profit organizations interested in broadcast employment opportunities that would enable them to better refer job candidates for broadcast positions.

Participated in **other** activities designed by the station employment unit reasonably calculated to further the goal of disseminating information as to employment opportunities in broadcasting to job candidates who might otherwise be unaware of such opportunities.

Pacifica Foundation's National Human Resources director, Yolanda Thomas, held a 3 hour class to train the entire staff of WBAI on equal employment opportunity, how to prevent violence at the work place and sexual harassment. This class was held in November 2006.

Our WAKE UP CALL SHOW host trains a diverse group of students to become journalists. The selection of students is from various non-for-profit grassroots organizations. This is an ongoing program to educate the youth in broadcasting and radio production.

WBAI has an ongoing community outreach program, participating in at least 1 event weekly as media sponsors with grassroots community organizations and educational institutions where information about WBAI is distributed including information for employment when job openings are available at WBAI.
